Note that Tower Hamlets was included within the top 25 largest Jewish populations in 2001, but it had dropped below that level by 2011. There were 1,831 Jews living there in 2001 placing it 25th on the list. By 2011, that number had dropped by 418 people, equivalent to 22.8%, and stood at 1,413.
